## **Class Descriptions:**

### **Grades 7-12:**

#### **Exploring Creation with Physical Science**

(continues into Spring Semester – full year course) Teachers: Cook/Patterson

This course will cover the entire Apologia Exploring Creation with Physical Science Second Edition text. Students will do most experiments in class, with most lab supplies provided in class. Students will read text and answer text questions at home; they will bring written work to class for class discussion. Students will be required to write a lab report for each experiment. Tests will be taken at home and graded by the parent.

Required text: Exploring Creation with Physical Science, Second Edition AND Test and Solutions Manual.

#### **P.E.**

(Teacher: Cogar) Students will participate in structured physical activity, learning game rules, technique and sportsmanship.

#### **Art**

(Teacher: Bryan) This course will cover the basics of watercolor and drawing.

#### **Literature and Composition**

(full year course) Teacher: Essa This course will cover four literature selections to be analyzed and discussed in class as well as instruction on various forms of composition including expository, persuasive and book report writing. In the second semester, students will write a research report. Tailored to grades 4-6, 7-8 and 9-12.

#### **Middle School History**

(full year course) Teachers: Cook/Patterson. This course will use the 8<sup>th</sup> grade ABeka text, America, Land that I Love. Students will do most reading and write answers to text questions at home. Tests and quizzes will be taken at home and graded by parents. Class time will be spent in discussion and review. Text listed above is required. Optional: Test and Quiz books and Answer Keys.

#### **Art History**

(Teacher: Rank) Text: Short Lessons in Art History: 35 Artists and Their Work by Phyllis C. Barker, Published by Walch Education Publishing. Can be purchased at CBD (\$20.49) and Rainbow Resource (\$18.50).

Students will read about 2-3 artists each week and complete various writing and art assignments at home. They will learn about each artist's life, along with their major works, public reaction, and impact upon the world and art after their deaths. The major art movements – their style, technique, public tastes, and materials used - will be learned as well. In class students will participate in discussion and review. ½ credit is earned after completing this class.

### **Grades 4-6**

#### **Swimming Creatures of the Fifth Day**

( full year course) Teachers: Little/ . “Apologia’s Exploring Creation with Zoology 2: Swimming Creatures of the Fifth Day elementary science book by Jeannie Fulbright will take you and your family on an exploration into the wonders of swimming creatures made on the fifth day of Creation.”- from the Apologia website. Students will have weekly reading assignments and will do experiments and/or projects in class. Text listed above is required for the course.

### **Map Skills**

(Teacher: Sage) This course will cover the basics of maps and map reading: learning symbols, map language, directions, latitude and longitude, as well as some geography using various kinds of maps and the globe.

### **Literature and Composition**

(Teacher: Essa) See description above.

### **English from the Roots Up**

(Teachers: Sage, Smith) Using the curriculum English from the Roots Up: Help for Reading, Writing, Spelling and SAT Scores, this class will cover 100 Greek and Latin root words in a creative, hands-on approach. The majority of our English words are rooted in these classical languages, and learning the roots opens the door to increasing vocabulary as well as improving comprehension and spelling.

### **Letters from Rifka**

(Teacher: Morgan) This literature unit study will cover the book Letters from Rifka by Karen Hess. Students will need to purchase this text and will be required to read it at home on assigned dates. In class, students will be designing their own passports to use for various assignments. Small literature/unit study with hands-on projects.

### **Elections**

(Teacher: Brooks) This unit study will introduce students to the election process and include fun, hands-on learning activities.

### **PE**

### **Grades 1-3**

### **Composers**

(Teacher: Rank) The goal of this class is to get to know 10 different composers, become familiar with their music, and learn a little about orchestra as well. Through a short biography, we will learn who the composer was, what music he created, when and where he lived, etc. We will listen to the composer's music and become familiar with one well known piece. As we learn the sections of the orchestra we will discover the instruments that make up those sections.

### **Presidents**

(Swetnam) This class will highlight 10 of the nation's most beloved presidents.

(full year course) Teachers: Little/ .See description above.

### **Map Skills**

(Teacher: Morgan) Students will construct their own map and have a good introduction to all the basics of map reading skills.

### **Pre-K and K:**

#### **Basic Skills**

(In need of a teacher). This class will cover ABCs, 123s and other basic skills.

#### **Boz**

Students will participate in a video-driven music and physical movement program.

#### **Story Time**

(Teacher: Degnan) Students will be read classic stories and nursery rhymes from the likes of Eric Carle, Dr. Seuss, etc.

#### **Musikgarten**

(Teacher: Purvis) Students will participate in the Musikgarten curriculum.

## **Friday East Campus Elective Day at Pleasant Grove**

### **(Grades 7-12)**

#### **Rosetta Stone Spanish**

(Cooperative teaching panel) This course will use the Rosetta Stone Spanish curriculum, which each participating family will be required to purchase. Students will have daily work to do at home. Class time will be spent on correct pronunciation and questions.

#### **Speech**

(Teacher: Bryan) This course will cover the basics of public speaking, with students actually using the skills learned in the course to prepare and present a speech at one of our opening co-op assemblies.

#### **Finance**

(full year course) Teacher: Bryan. This course will use Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University. Students will be required to purchase accompanying workbook.

#### **Elections**

(Teacher: Essa) This course will introduce students to the election process, party lines, campaign finance, and various other aspects related to elections in the United States.

#### **Home Economics**

(In need of a teacher) This course will use the A Beka Home Economics curriculum, Family/Consumer Sciences. From the A Beka website: "A practical introduction course to cooking. Includes nutrition, meal management and etiquette. Lab manual also needed."

#### **Yearbook**

(full year course) Teacher: Cook. Students in this course will produce a yearbook for the East Campus Co-op. Students will take photos throughout the co-op sessions and then print the photos they desire to use. Students will prepare titles for the pages and write short course descriptions. Pages will be designed in the manner of a scrapbook and then printed and bound. Required supplies: Access to a camera and ability to print/develop photos.

**HFHG East Campus Co-Op Fall 2008 Open Registration Information:**

The HFHG East Campus Co-op is a co-op with a large emphasis on middle and high school students. We meet on Mondays at The Church Gathered at Calvin on Rudy Lane, and will be adding an elective day on Friday at Pleasant Grove Baptist Church on Aiken Rd.

Our middle and high school students (The Academy) and their siblings follow a 16-week schedule beginning on August 18 and ending on Dec. 15, and elementary students follow a 12-week schedule beginning on August 25 and ending Dec.15 (a detailed calendar will be provided upon registration.)

Please note that most of our Academy classes meet high school credit requirements.

Open Registration for this co-op will be held on **Monday, June 2 from noon until 2:30 pm at Calvin**. Registration fees will be \$95 per family for one day, with an additional \$10 fee for a second day for Primary families, and \$125 per family for one day, with an additional \$10 fee for a second day for Academy families. Certain classes will have class fees and/or text requirements. Whether you attend one hour or four hours, the rate will be the same. Class sizes are limited, and registration will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Teachers and returning families will register early, so classes may fill up.
